I for one know that I certainly need God's forgiveness and help to get me through life, but I am also dependant upon his people to live out life with me through both good and difficult times.

As a family, during our time in Seagoe, we have certainly appreciated people being with us thought difficult times such as illnesses, bereavements, discouragements etc. Many of our Seagoe family have drawn close to us realising that we are like every other family, in that we also experience life's difficulties. I remember when a close friend of mine, Father Martin McAlinden, died, that I was visiting a house where friends were gathering to mourn the loss of their friend. As I sympathised with those gathered one of the people there said to me something like, 'and we are also thinking of you in loosing your friend too'. I was deeply humbled and comforted by those few words of empathy. As the verse above says, 'mourn with those who mourn'.

But not only does the Seagoe family seek to be with one another in difficult times, we also rejoice with those who rejoice. In fact

I love the way the Rotunda has provided a great place for people to gather that is often filled with laughter, celebration of birthdays, anniversaries etc. The rejoicing together is so heartfelt and uplifting. Certainly I don't think it could be said that people go out from Seagoe with long faces!!

Recently Alison and I were totally overwhelmed by the love and celebration we experienced when we returned from celebrating our 25th wedding anniversary with our first ever cruise. Many people had already been in touch to congratulate us, but on the Sunday after we returned we were so taken aback by the photographs that were displayed via the PowerPoint and by the gifts we were given. As if that was not enough, we were blown away when we entered the Rotunda to be greeted by so many cheering people and an amazing cake with an iced photograph of us as a newly married couple!!! Alison even said she was lost for words-something I don't think I have ever witnessed before!!!

We both want to again convey our most sincere gratitude for the totally unexpected outpouring of

love and for people's generosity. It truly is humbling to be part of such a fellowship that shares in the ups and downs of life together. May the Lord continue, by His Spirit, to direct us all as we seek to live out the Christian faith together, and as a result may others say, 'see how these Christians love one another'.

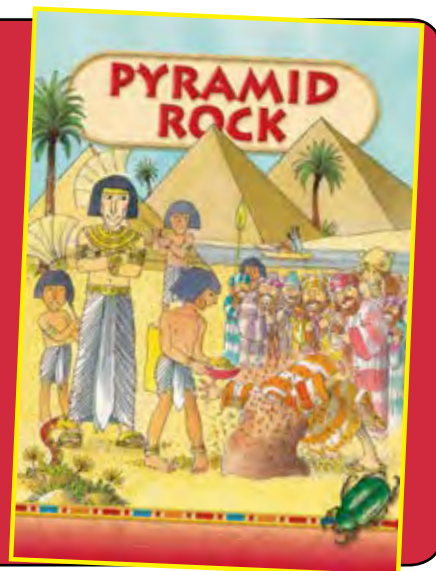
Holiday Bible Club PYRAMID ROCK

Seagoe Youth Club wins share of £5.9m investment

Seagoe Youth Club is to share in a funding package of almost £6 million for the development of new facilities.

The ten capital schemes across Northern Ireland that have been confirmed will now advance to the planning stage.

The Youth Group, lead by a dedicated leadership team of paid and volunteer leaders, offers youth work six evenings a week and in addition is engaged in a variety of schools projects in partnership with the Education Authority.

The Management Committee of the Youth Group has struggled to maintain the current buildings at Killicomaine and so applied to the Department of Education for a major works grant to improve the facilities. Various options were discussed ranging from a major refurbishment of the complex to a complete rebuild.

The Management Committee of Seagoe Youth Group are looking forward to working with the Department as the plans unfold further.

The timing of this grant coincides with Seagoe Youth Group's recruitment campaign for a replacement Leader in Charge due to the current Leader in Charge, Kevin Quigley, moving to a new post with the Education Authority based at Brownlow.

Seagoe Parish Financial Accounts 2017

With this magazine is enclosed a 2 page summary of the 2017 Financial Accounts of Seagoe Parish

Donations and Legacies - You will notice increases in FWO, Tax Recovered, Standing Orders and Other (including one of gifts). These are attributed to the stewardship campaign. Mission Donations are for the Rwandan Mission and Hannah Cadden's SAMS Mission. There were decreases in Restoration Donations and Special Collections.

Other Income - Grants are for the church tower, Seagoe Ministries increased their donations to the parish. Ardmore is money we receive for sharing clergy. Killiplant is money we receive for Jim Fleming.

Overall income has increased by £30,000 compared to 2016.

Expenditure - You will notice increases in Wages and Salaries of

£27,000 due to Rev Stuart Moles and Mr Jim Fleming joining in the summer and Rev Raj Satyaraj reducing to half time.

This was mitigated by reductions in church running costs, charitable donations and Seagoe Ministries costs.

Overall expenditure has increased by £4,700 compared to 2016.

In 2018 we expect to incur major expenditure on our church tower of £50,000 despite expected grant assistance of £129,000. The Select Vestry has also begun investigating possible work on the church heating, lighting, rewiring and waterproofing of the church building which will cost a significant amount.

There is also expected to be increased clergy costs of £42,500 in 2018 due to Rev Stuart Moles and Mr Jim Fleming being employed throughout the year.

Please continue to support Seagoe Parish so we can achieve our stated aims in our stewardship material.

Thanks to all who attended and we hope you enjoyed it as much as we did. Special mention goes to Boyd McClurg who came along and took the photos on the evening. Work will now begin on planning an international trip to Poland, looking to link some of the research carried out here in Portadown with our European neighbours.

During the 8 week course we worked on building confidence, goal setting, putting together a great CV, tailoring applications to the job being applied for and interview skills.

Data Protection

Secretary) as our Data Controller to work along with Terence to oversee the implementation of the new regulations. Phyllis and Terence attended training events and waded through paperwork sent by the Central Church Authorities to help them in the process. A variety of documents are being adapted for our situation and e-mails and letters will be produced to invite parishioners to give permission for their data to be held and used to enable the smooth running of the Parish. It is vital that everyone on the data base responds either to agree to us holding and using their data, or to ask for it to be removed. Obviously removal will mean that those people will no longer be counted as Parishioners.
